The bride, who admits she can be a bit of a control freak, has long dreamed of being a wedding planner and excitedly threw herself into making arrangements. They settled on a palette of peony pink and apple green with touches of gold.

Lee's mermaid-style gown by Justina McCaffrey featured a Chantilly lace overlay with gold embroidery. Her bridesmaid dresses were designed to echo her gown's delicate details, including the ribbon-wrapped waist. The two-piece, peony pink ensembles featured an organza overlay on top and a floor-length silk dupioni skirt. Their peppy, preppy hues were set off by the brilliant bouquets—pink peonies, ranunculus, and roses for the bride and even bolder arrangements of parrot tulips, hydrangeas, peonies, and roses for the maids.

Lee and Jeffrey exchanged traditional vows in an outdoor ceremony on the front terrace of Arlington Hall, overlooking Turtle Creek. Iron cones covered with moss, baby apples, roses, hydrangea, and gold organza ribbon sat at the end of each row of gold chiavari chairs. The bride's particularly stylish entrance began as she entered through white double doors flanked by moss-covered N's before starting down the aisle. 

"Jeffrey and his groomsmen were in the groom's quarters right before the wedding and they were carrying on, being guys," says Lee. "Little did they know his mic was on and everyone could hear everything they were saying!"

The reception that followed took over the entire hall. As guests arrived, they signed a large version of Lee and Jeffrey's engagement photo, which now hangs in the couple's home. They then proceeded to a terrace (aptly named the Lee Terrace) for cocktails, piano music, cigars, and grilled swordfish and lamb. Once the reception started, other rooms were reserved for relaxing—and for the bride's cake, a square, five-tier amaretto cake decorated like Limoges porcelain, and the groom's cake, a two-tier monogrammed chocolate confection.

The porch of the terrace where the ceremony had taken place held two buffet stations. But the bulk of the fun unfolded in the Great Hall, a Greek revival ballroom, with an Italian-inspired dinner, music, dancing, and toasts. Alternating pink and green table linens were topped with tea lights and cylinders filled with green apples, pink and green hydrangeas, tulips, peonies, ranunculus, and roses.



